TEACHERS' REPORTS

Science

There is so much to look forward to in Term 1! As always, we are approaching science with a 'hands on - hearts on' approach. This means we will be actively manipulating materials and conducting investigations, making connections and developing deep understanding, and acknowledging the importance of understanding the world around us in order to take better care of it.







Our Stage 5 students will be investigating Force and Motion, using hands-on materials to make devices to explore these concepts in a practical way. We will also move onto studying various forms of energy and how it is transferred and transformed. This unit will include many investigations so students can understand how energy can be conserved.

As we progress into their preliminary year, Year 11 Investigating Science students will be discovering the core of what Science is all about. They will have the opportunity to carry out a number of first-hand and secondary source investigations where they will learn about cause and effect, and how to make detailed and accurate observations, determine variables, develop testable hypotheses and collect quantitative and qualitative data. A highlight is sure to be our hands-on research and water testing at key locations around the Central Coast, where we will investigate water quality and its impact on plant and animal life.

Our Year 12 students have already made a great start to their HSC course during Term 4 and we will be continuing our study of the Technologies unit. Through practical investigations, students will take a variety of measurements and consider the appropriateness of a range of technologies in order to do this accurately. We will then move on to completing a Depth study, which will include many excursions to a wetland, chosen by the class, and the formulation of their own scientific report.

I encourage all students to attend class regularly, as this will help them to master each new concept and build their understanding through hands-on, engaging activities. See you all at the start of Term 1!
